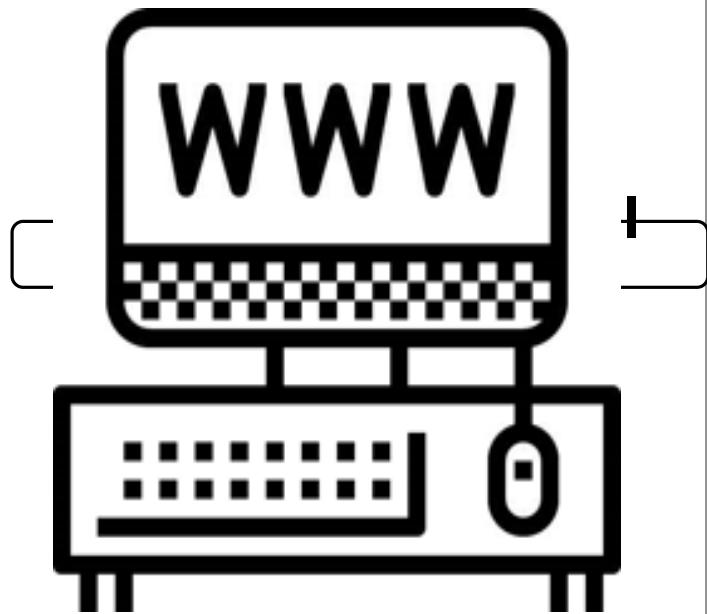

- Students can submit their application through the JAE-IS using their Singpass.
- Applicants are strongly encouraged to use the *JAE worksheet* before submitting their online application.
- You will receive a verification slip through your email

*For students who are unable to submit their application via the JAE-IS, or need to update your citizenship or residential address, you can submit a request for assistance using the online JAE Request Form during the JAE application period.

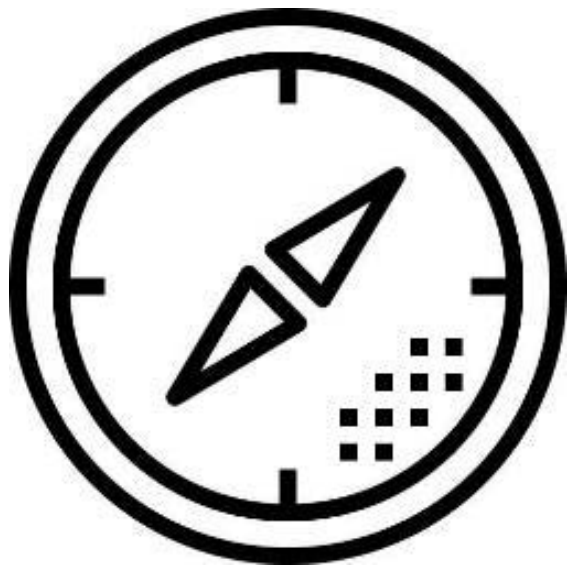
- **Use all your 12 JAE choices** carefully by choosing courses **comparable to your aggregate scores (list in order of preference)**
- Choose at least 2 – 3 courses where your aggregate scores are much **better than the COP (cut-off-point)**.

Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

How can I maximise my 12 choices?

- **First 3 to 4 choices:** Consider the courses that most align with your Values, Interests, Personality & Skills (V.I.P.S) and strengths.
- **Next 3 to 4 choices:** Choose what you are interested in and stand a good chance of getting into by considering the last aggregate scores of the courses in each institution (where your net score is within the range of the last year's aggregate score) in CourseFinder/SchoolFinder.
- **Last few choices:** Include alternative courses and institutions where the last aggregate scores are higher than yours. With this, your chances of securing a place will be higher.
- **Fill up all 12 choices** even if you are really confident of getting into your desired course.



- If you did not receive a JAE posting, ITE might offer you a place in a 2-year *Nitec* or 3-year *Higher Nitec* course soon after the release of the JAE posting results.
- If you hear from ITE, do consider the offer carefully, as it will give you a chance to continue your studies
- If you have accepted ITE's offer, you still have the option of appealing for a 2-year *Higher Nitec* course during JAE appeals

Direct School Admission – JC

- Students who had accepted offers through the **2024 DSA-JC** are admitted to their chosen JC if they meet the **eligibility criteria** for admission to. You will **not** be eligible to participate in JAE.
- Students who do not meet the JC admission criteria may take part in JAE to apply for other eligible courses.

Early Admissions Exercise - POLY

- Students who had earlier accepted conditional offers through EAE will have their offers **confirmed** and they will not be eligible to participate in JAE if they meet the criteria :
 - **A net ELR2B2 \leq 26 and**
 - **Meet minimum Entry Requirements(MER)** for the poly course.
- Students who do not meet the above criteria may still apply for poly admission via the JAE to apply for eligible poly courses.

Early Admissions Exercise - ITE

- Students who had **accepted conditional offers** to an ITE course through ITE EAE in 2024 and have their offers confirmed based on their GCE O-Level results will not be eligible to participate in the JAE.
- Their EAE offers are confirmed if they meet the **subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements** for the course.

DPP Applications (2-yr Higher Nitec in ITE) Applications for 4NA students Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme

- **Eligible to apply** : ELMAB3 \leq 19 points **and** meet the subject-specific requirements for chosen course.
- Submit DPP applications online via the DPP application portal from:
10th Jan 2025 (12am) to 14th Jan 2025 (11.59pm)
- DPP posting results : **17th Jan 2025 (9am)**
- Important to indicate whether they wish to **accept or reject DPP offer by 21st Jan 2025 (11.59pm)**
- Successful applicants - **report to ITE on 22 Jan**

Poly Foundation Programme(PFP) Applications for 4NA students

- **PFP – eligible** students will receive a copy of **Form P**. Each copy of Form P contains a unique password
- Interested applicants should use the respective passwords to submit their applications online via the PFP website

- **Applications for PFP** : Opens 1.30pm, 10th Jan 2025
Ends 4 pm, 15th Jan 2025
Posting Results for PFP : 22nd Jan 2025 (1.30pm)

*Important to accept, reject or appeal for a change of course by
Monday 27th Jan 2024 (4pm)

Sec 5N students who accepted PFP poly offer- last day Fri 31 Jan 2025.


Students who have accepted a place in the earlier application phase of the DPP in December but decide to take up a PFP offer now must withdraw from the DPP first before they are able to take up the PFP offer.

- **Must apply for JAE**
- **Required to make an appointment with Vice-Principal on Mon 13th Jan**
- Submit application form to the General Office by **14th Jan, 4pm.**
- Bring your results slip

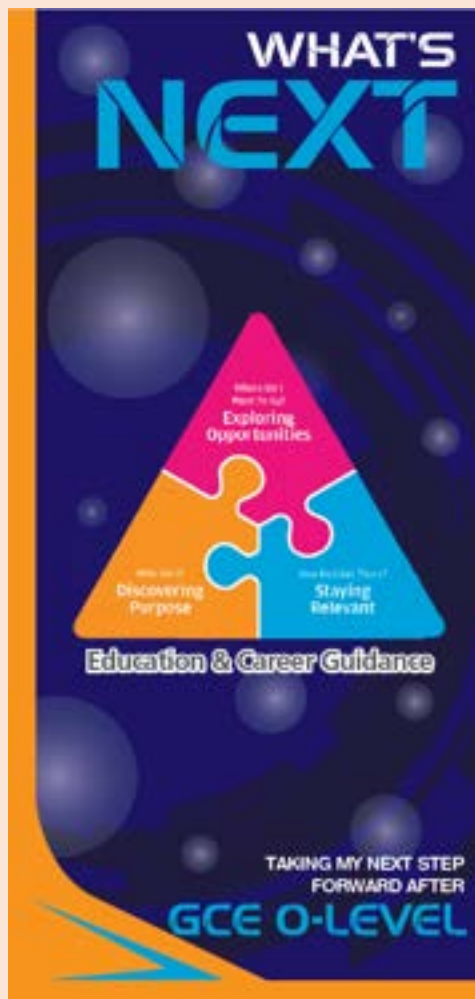

- Calm yourself down. Take a few deep breaths.

- Think through the different options that are available for you. Keep things in perspective.
- Remember that the O-Level is not the end point and is only one part of your life journey.

Do


- Have conversations with trusted adults who know you well to advise and guide you (parents, teachers, ECG counsellor).
- Decide and act based on your options.

When you receive your results, you may experience a range of emotions.

Managing these emotions well will allow you to stay calm and make rational decisions.
